POLICY AND GUIDELINES

These policies come from our values. We ask that all families participating in Abundant Homes abide by the following. Please check and initial by each of the following or acknowledge online.

- □ Statement of Faith/Theology
- Values. All behavior should fall under the values of Equip, Edify, Encourage, Educate, Excellence, and Steward. No gossip, slander, disrespect or behavior towards others that is not Equipping, Edifying, Encouraging will be tolerated. All members are expected to steward the building and materials well. (Students must sign Student Policy and Moms the DG Policy)
- □ All Students Registered: On Thursday Family Days all students over 18 months must be registered for class. Only infants under 18 months or nursing may be present in mom time.
- □ *Not A Drop off program:* On Thursday Family Days the parent or responsible guardian is expected to remain in the building and take an active participant role.
- Weekly Wednesday classes will also require a parent or guardian to stay on campus unless the student can drive themselves.
- ❑ When not in classes students and families must remain in common areas where AH personnel are present (rotunda, foyer, game room, sanctuary.) No play or wandering in hallways, upstairs, empty classrooms or closed off areas.
- Non-parent policy: Grandparents or another member family may bring students of another parent if that parent is not able to attend. Grandparent or member friend is fully responsible for students and must remain on the premises for the full length of the class time or event. Guardianship form must be signed, AH personnel and the teacher notified.
- **G** Field Trips: AH does not legally cover liability for field trips. You attend at your own risk.
- Safety Guidelines: Name tags must be worn at all times. Please sign out any child under 12 yourself from the teacher. Anyone over 18 working with children is background checked and must attend a safety meeting.
- □ All fees are non-refundable.

STUDENT CONDUCT GUIDELINES

5. KNOW OUR PURPOSE- LEARNING & FELLOWSHIP Ecclesiastes 3:1 There is an appointed time for everything. A time for every event under heaven.

STUDENT CONDUCT PROCEDURE

Teacher will make guidelines clear at the beginning of each class. Mom will go over guidelines before class with student.

Process for infractions:

2 Timothy 3:16-17 All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness; so that the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work.

Teaching: Clearly teach students expectations at the beginning of each class.

1st infraction- Reproof: Student will be told which guideline they are not abiding by and given a reminder on how to meet expectation and mom will be told at the end of class
2nd infraction - Correct: Above steps will be repeated and teacher coordinator/director along with mom will be called to meet with student and explain behavior expectations again. Self-evaluation checklist will be given to student at the end of class period to help them remember expectations.

3rd infraction- Train: Above steps will be repeated and student and mom may be asked to withdraw from class until more training and teaching is done and student is ready to abide by guidelines. Option to meet with the director and/or other staff to work on a training to restore the child back to guidelines.

Behavior that is cause for immediate dismissal of program for the semester: Outright disrespect, violent behavior towards others, going into private/closed off areas, drug use, inappropriate sexual behavior.

- Criticism and complaining will not be tolerated. We ask for constructive ideas that will Edify and make the group more Excellent. We ask that if you see a problem you be a part of the solution.
