## Resurrection Eggs

## Materials:

- 12 count egg carton
- 12 plastic eggs
- Picture of donkey
- Picture of praying hands
- Picture of a sword
- Picture of crown of thorns
- Picture of feet
- Picture of temple
- Piece of bread
- coin
- Small cross
- Nail
- Piece of white cloth
- Piece of string
- Piece of a sponge
- Small rock
- Black piece of paper
- Torn piece of red cloth


## Instructions:

Number each egg with a marker, 1-12. Some days you will do more eggs than other days.Put each of the items or pictures in the eggs. As you read and talk about the passage for the day have the younger students open the egg to help hem remember what the passage was about.

## Resurrection Eggs

## DAY 1- SUNDAY

Egg \#1 Donkey- Jesus Rode into Jerusalem on a donkey-
Read Luke 19: 28-39-

## DAY 2 \& 3- MONDAY \& TUESDAY

Egg \#2 Temple- Jesus taught in the temple during the week before his death .
Read Luke 19:45-20:47

## DAY 4- WEDNESDAY

Egg \# 3 Coin- Judas betrayed Jesus and sold Him for 30 pieces of silver.
Read Luke 22:1-6

DAY 5- THURSDAY
Egg \# 4 Piece of Bread- Jesus ate the Passover Meal with His disciples.
Read Luke 22:7-23
Egg \# 5 Feet- Jesus washed His disciples' feet to show servant hood.
Read John 13: 12-20
Egg \# 6 Praying Hands- Jesus went to the garden to pray.
Read Luke 22: 39-46

DAY 6 - FRIDAY
Egg \#7 Sword- The crowd came to arrest Jesus with swords and weapons.
Piece of String- Jesus was beaten with a whip.
Crown of Thorns- Jesus was mocked and dressed like a king.
Read Luke 22:47-53; Luke 23:1-25

Egg \# 8 Nail and cross - Jesus was nailed to a cross.
Egg \# 9 Sponge- Jesus was thirsty and they gave Him vinegar on a sponge.
Read Luke 23:33-38

Egg \# 10 Torn piece of red cloth- the veil in the temple torn in two.
Black piece of paper- There was darkness when Jesus died
Read Luke 23: 44-46
DAY 7-SATURDAY
Egg \# 11 Cloth- Jesus' body was wrapped in cloths.
Rock- Jesus was put in a tomb and a stone was rolled in front of it.
Read Luke 23: 50-56

DAY 8- SUNDAY
Egg \# 12 Empty Egg- Jesus rose from the grave and the tomb was empty.
Read Luke 24: 1-12, 36-49
